


VETERINARY MEDICINE

How do you become a VETERINARIAN?

Veterinarians must have a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) degree from an **accredited veterinary college**, as well as a **state license**. Most veterinarians earn a bachelor's degree in biology, zoology, or other life science before pursuing a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.

SIMILAR OCCUPATIONS

VETERINARY TECHNOLOGIST:

Veterinary technologists and technicians perform medical tests under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian to assist in diagnosing the injuries and illnesses of animals. Technologists usually need a 4-year bachelor's degree, and technicians need a 2-year associate's degree.



ZOOLOGIST AND WILDLIFE BIOLOGIST:

Zoologists and wildlife biologists study animals and how they interact with their ecosystems. They study animal characteristics and behaviors and the human impact on natural habitats. These positions typically require at least a bachelor's degree. Many schools offer programs in zoology and wildlife biology or in a related field, such as ecology.




MICROBIOLOGIST:

Microbiologists study microorganisms such as bacteria, viruses, algae, fungi, and some types of parasites. They try to understand how these organisms live, grow, and interact with their environments.
